Wednesday, March 24 at 7:00 p.m.

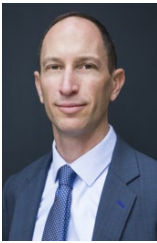
Join us for a virtual (via Zoom) book club led by Rachel Polansky. We will discuss *The Orchard* by David Hopen. Click [HERE](#) to register.

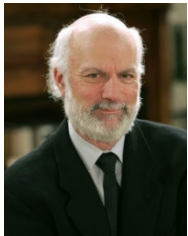
