A MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT MEHRZAD ROSHAN

A few days ago, I returned to the Pacific Palisades village, where the devastating fire on January 7th had left nothing but destruction. Homes, schools, businesses, and places of worship lay in ruins, with hundreds of trucks clearing away the charred debris. Thousands of trees have been burned down. Block after block, the sight of destruction was overwhelming. As I passed by the local elementary school, now reduced to rubble, I saw a single word on the billboard in front: Hope.

I paused and asked myself- what truly gives us hope in times like these?

Later that afternoon, I received a poem written by Sabrina Amini, a fourth-grade student in our Religious School. Reading her words, I found my answer.

Our children and their future- this is what gives us hope.

Sabrina's poem is below:

Dear God:

We thank you for the roofs above our heads, the food we eat, and the health of our bodies. Thank you for keeping us safe and happy even in dark times.
