# SOURCES FOR STUDY

Shamai said: Greet every person with a pleasant expression of countenance" (Pirkei Avot 1:15).

There are three parts to this statement.

- 1. Countenance: The minimum you should do is turn your face toward your fellow man. You should not greet anyone with the side of your face. When your fellow man enters the room, you should not display your profile, but should turn your full countenance toward him.
- 2. Expression: It is not enough to confront people with an expressionless countenance which has no more character than the bottom of a pan. You must face your fellow man with a countenance which denotes interest.
- 3. Pleasant: In addition to the above, one's countenance should also be pleasant.

Since God deals with man measure for measure, God makes God's face shine upon those whose faces shine to their fellow man.
