Matot–Masei: Should We Stay or Should We Go?

As the book of Numbers comes to a close and the Israelites finally come to the edge of the Promised Land, their forty-year endeavor nearly comes undone in a moment. Two (and a half) of the twelve tribes voice their wish not to enter the land along with their people but to stay back on the far side of the Jordan River, where their cattle can graze and their children can grow up in peace.

Moses is rightly outraged: "Are your brothers to go to war," he objects, "while you stay here?"

It's an objection I cannot help but hear as an American Jew living outside the modern day State of Israel, especially as my two-month sojourn here nears its end. War has cast its unrelenting shadow for the past 659 days (and counting); husbands, fathers, brothers, and sons have served for almost as many. Peace of the kind I take for granted—and to which I will return in two weeks' time—seems an unearned privilege.

Of course, we cannot all join the war effort. And, in truth, we in the Diaspora have enough of a fight to contend with on the field of ideas if not of battle. Like the tribes who make their home outside the Land, we have an obligation to be halutzim, "equipped" with the knowledge, purpose, and resolve to stand up for our brothers and sisters in Israel as well as ourselves. May we be heartened by the refrain with which we conclude each book of the Torah: hazak hazak v'nithazek "Be strong, be strong, and let us strengthen each other."
