Nitzavim: Circumcise Your Heart

As Moses continues his parting soliloquy to the people of Israel, he makes them this promise:

"The LORD your God will open up (literally 'circumcise') your heart and the hearts of your offspring to love the LORD your God with all your heart and soul, in order that you may live." (Deuteronomy 30:6)

Yet only chapters earlier, Moses invoked the same metaphor not as a promise but an exhortation:

"And now, O Israel, what does the LORD your God demand of you? [Only] to serve the LORD your God with all your heart and soul ... Circumcise, therefore, the foreskin of your heart and stiffen your neck no more." (10:12–16)

So, which is it? Will God open up their hearts—and our own—or will we?

The Midrash comes to reconcile the discrepancy, and in so doing teaches a profound truth about the teshuvah "repentance" that is our task in this season:

"The Holy Blessed One said to Israel: My children, open for Me a door of repentance like the eye of a needle, and I will open for you gates through which wagons and carriages can pass."

In true rabbinic fashion, the answer is both. We must open up our hearts to honest reflection, sincere repentance, and earnest repair as much as we are able—if only by a pinhole—and God will find a way in, opening us up to the noblest, worthiest, and holiest of ourselves from the inside out.
