Tol'dot: Widen Your Tent

While the debate over "nature versus nurture" might never be settled finally, no one can argue against the reality of the former. Any sibling (myself included) knows that two children raised by the same parents in the same household inevitably turn out differently. Even twins identical in body are never identical in mind and spirit.

Such is the case of the Torah's first twins, Jacob and Esau. One is smooth-skinned, the other hairy; one is a mild-mannered pastoralist and the other a brash hunter. It's only natural that they be dissimilar. So why does God so strongly favor the one over the other?

Perhaps it's not for their natures but for the traits they nurtured (or failed to) in themselves. We're told that Jacob grew to be a *yoshev ohalim* "dwelling in tents." Radak (Rabbi David Kimchi), a 13th-century biblical commentator, takes this to mean that Jacob was indiscriminating in whom he learned with and from—that he had an "open-tent policy," so to speak. Esau, on the other hand, is described as *yodea tzayid* "a skillful hunter." In light of Radak's comment, we might read tzayid instead as *tzad* "side": Esau was one who took sides—in his case, against the Jewish tradition that was his birthright.

As our patriarch and namesake, Jacob sets the example for us to follow. We must widen our tents to include those with whom we disagree, and not choose sides to keep those we want in and those we don't out. Granted, we must also have boundaries; those, like Esau, who spurn their heritage and their people might not be part of our tribe. But even they are our siblings. Though their natures might differ markedly from our own, we can and must still nurture our respect for, relation to, and reconciliation with each other. Shabbat Shalom.
