

For each service, there are two kinds of files, large (8.5x11) and booklet size (8.5x14).

The 8.5x11 version is easier to look at on a screen, because the pages are all in sequential order. It also works better if someone wants to use it to study/practice the prayers on their tablet/smartphone/etc. When printed up, however, it is a bit clunky (although it can be used as a “large type” version).

The 8.5x14 file is set up to be printed double-sided on legal-sized paper. The paper is then sliced down the middle, folded over, and bound, which creates a siddur-sized book.

I recommend a coil-type binding, so that the book can be folded completely over during use. People tend to do this anyway, so using a coil binding will increase the sturdiness and lifetime of the book.

IMPORTANT: Make sure your printer binds the book on the right-hand side, or it will turn into an English opening book!
